## Fellowship Learning Exchange

The Bank's Fellowship program was launched in 2003. It is designed to encourage leading-edge research and to develop expertise in Canada in a number of areas critical to the Bank's mandate: macroeconomics, monetary economics, international finance, as well as the economics of financial markets and institutions, including their stability.

An important part of the Fellowship Program is the participation of the Fellowship recipients in an annual Learning Exchange here at the Bank. This provides an opportunity for the recipients to share their research findings and discuss issues of mutual interest with Bank staff. The meetings will take place Tuesday 31 October to 2 November.

### What to expect

On Tuesday, 31 October, the Fellowship recipients will come together for a plenary session. They will each speak briefly on research and policy issues that should be given more attention by central banks.

This session will be of general interest to all Bank employees. It will be moderated by John Murray, advisor to the Governor and member of the Fellowship Nominating Committee.

The Fellowship recipients will give individual presentations of their work on 1 November and the morning of 2 November.
